

## Central Intake

The Central Intake Department evaluates a person's needs, establishes eligibility, and connects them with the appropriate programs and services.

## Vocational Services

*Key Industries* provides vocational rehabilitation services to people with disabilities. These vocational services consist of evaluation, skill training, career counseling, job placement, job coaching, work experience for transitioning students and supports on the job. Employment opportunities include center based and community placement, individual or group settings. Our goal is to assist people with disabilities in finding employment that is compatible with their abilities, interests and resources.

## Day Habilitation

Wayne ARC Day Habilitation programs are community-focused services that help individuals to acquire, retain or improve their self-help, socialization and adaptive skills. Activities and environments are designed to foster the development of each person in the areas of communication, socialization, independence, travel, community inclusion, relationship building, self-advocacy and informed choice, mental and psychological well-being, artistic expression and physical health.

## Community Services

The CSP Program provides support to families caring for a family member with a disability in their home. The program offers a variety of services including Community Habilitation, Respite Services, Family Education and Training, Behavior Management, Parenting for Success, Homemakers, Family Reimbursement, FSS Transportation, Parent Support, After-school Arts & Wellness and Recreation.

## Roosevelt Children's Center

RCC is an early intervention and preschool program for children ages birth to five. RCC provides the highest quality of service to all children, with and without special needs, in an integrated and natural setting. RCC also provides a variety of home and community based options to serve students and families in Wayne and surrounding counties.



## Service Coordination

Service coordination provides assessment, referral and support which aides individuals in accessing vital services and planning for their future. An emphasis is placed on empowering people to make informed choices and determine their personal goals. Service Coordinators assist individuals in directing their supports and services.

## Guardianship

Wayne ARC provides guardianship services and assistance to families in planning for the future needs of their developmentally disabled family members. Wayne ARC also maintains guardianship of some individuals served by us when other options are not available

## Clinical Services

Wayne ARC operates an Article 16 Clinic offering a variety of services both in Wayne County and its satellite sites. The clinic provides therapeutic services to people with disabilities and their families. The clinic provides assessment, counseling and therapy in a wide range of clinical areas.

## Residential Services

The Residential Program offers a variety of options throughout Wayne County where individuals are encouraged to live as independently as possible in the community. People are supported by positive, caring and well-trained professionals. Individuals receive the resources and encouragement to develop abilities such as daily life skills, food preparation, financial management, and self-advocacy. They become involved in their communities and develop relationships with people they choose. Residential homes provide around the clock staffing to support the individuals. The supportive apartment program provides staffing as needed to empower people to live in as close to complete independence as possible. Wayne ARC provides all male, female, and co-ed residential settings.

## Assistive Support Services

Wayne ARC provides transportation services for individuals with developmental disabilities who live independently in the community. Transportation is provided to a variety of locations including grocery stores, malls, recreational events and visits to see family and friends. This service is provided to eligible individuals on a daily basis, including evenings and weekends.

## Nursing Services

The Wayne ARC Nursing Department provides nursing services for individuals attending the Wayne ARC Clinic, Day Habilitation, Key Industries, Residential Services, and Roosevelt Children's Center. The nurses coordinate and assist with health care provisions and education for individuals participating in the day programs and residential settings. The nurses provide staff education and clinical supervision in health related areas, to include general medical overview and medication administration certification.
